JCNA Annual General Meeting, March 11, 2023

Promoted as being held at the "City by the Bay", "a suburb by the airport" better describes the location for the San Francisco AGM. The host hotel was in Burlingame, a mile across the water from the southeast end of the San Francisco international Airport. That was fine as we bussed to events from there.

We await the minutes of the meeting for details. For now, here are a few of the major areas of discussion:

JCNA has returned to a positive cash flow and moved toward shoring up reserves, targeted at one year's operating expenses. But higher-than-anticipated inflation and increased *Jaguar Journal* printing and mailing costs will start eroding reserves again.

Delegates discussed a mix of possible tactics, such as moving *Jaguar Journal* to the existing digital version, perhaps charging for a print version, finding more efficiencies in operations, helping clubs grow membership, bringing Land Rover into the fold and implementing another JCNA dues increase. No action was taken, but delegates offered thoughtful comments and useful ideas.

Hanging over much of the JCNA plans is the unknowable future of the Jaguar brand. No funding by Jaguar is in the ongoing planning.

Changes to concours rules provided animated discussion, as it has at the last few AGM's. Those discussions and decisions will be sent to the chief judges and included in the 2024 concours season.

The JCNA Board of Directors met the Friday before and Sunday after the Saturday AGM to discuss these big issues and offer proposals to the members at the next AGM, March 16th in Charlotte, NC.

The Northwest Region was represented by delegates Wynne Wakkila and Tim Ashcroft of Jaguar Owners Club of Oregon; Chris Eseman and Paul Petach of Seattle Jaguar Club; and Northwest Region Directors Carole Borgens and Kurt Jacobson. Clubs that did not send delegates gave their proxy votes to Carole.

At the Saturday evening banquet and awards ceremony, Wynne Wakkila, Paul Petach, Kurt Jacobson and Carole Borgens all accepted either personal awards for their work, for members who did not attend, or JCNA competition trophies, which will be reported in club newsletters. Carole Borgens was honored with the prestigious Mike Cook President's award for her work with her British Columbia Clubs, representing the interest of the Canadian Clubs, and fostering inter-club sharing of resources and events in the Northwest Region. continued,

Attendees enjoyed a Friday welcome reception, San Francisco Bay tour for companions, a JAG people's choice Jaguar car show, and an exclusive visit to the John Mozart collection with its many Pebble Beach entrants and winners. Jaguar Associates Group was superb as host club. It is the largest club in JCNA and one of the oldest in North America. Many of their members turned out for events, were fun hosts and provided a first-class delegate experience. Unfortunately for attendees, but particularly for most Californians, the unrelenting state-wide parade of storms made life miserable for many locals and disrupted travel plans of several delegates.

This was Kurt Jacobson's final AGM as Northwest Region Director. Welcome to Brian Case, VP Technical at the Seattle Jaguar club, who has taken Kurt's place. Brian has been instrumental in the continued development of his home club and supporting cooperative efforts of the Northwest Region clubs.

Kurt will continue to participate in the JCNA Marketing Committee he created, and we look forward to the positive change this will bring to all aspects of JCNA operation.

JLR Jaguar now one of four JLR brands

"Jaguar Land Rover" is no more. The "Reimagine" corporate strategy announced back in 2021 has finally been confirmed by the British based automaker. JLR has to date been relatively tight lipped about Jaguar developments other than offering the brand would be fully electric by 2025. And it would be expensive. Not exactly reassuring news to the storied brands impassioned fanbase used to "Pace, Grace and Space"

"JLR" has confirmed that Jaguar will now be part of a "house of brands" along with Range Rover, Defender and Discovery lineups. What this means exactly for the Jaguar marque is uncertain however the repositioning may make sense for the brand. With its sister brands decidedly in the SUV lane it would leave room for Jaguar to eventually offer sportier options. As capable as SUV's are, lovers of a more exciting driving experience will be holding out hope for a true Jaguar GT or perhaps an estate or saloon variant. Wishful thinking perhaps but it's hard to imagine JLR's owners, the Tata Group shuttering it's most storied brand.



Jaguar is going all-electric by 2025

Jaguar intends to be an all-electric car brand by 2025 and this will mean an entirely new vehicle lineup will need to be developed. The current Jaguar internal combustion lineup will be produced and sold through the end of 2023 and into 2024 for some of the 75th anniversary editions after which the Jaguar internal combustion car will be no more. Relegated to the scrap heap of automotive history. The I-Pace EV, the only electric currently in the Jaguar stable will likely be the only model that survives the transition period.

Jaguar has confirmed that the relaunch will feature three all-new electric SUV models. The smaller vehicle will be sold in both two and four door variants, offered as two separate SUV's. Single-motor and dual-motor AWD versions will be available. The larger four-door SUV will be marketed as Grand Tourer with only the dual-motor AWD powertrain being offered.

The GT will be based on a purpose built platform named Jaguar Electric Architecture (JEA). It will offer more power than any previous Jaguar road car and have a range of well over 300 miles. Production will take place at the same Solihull, U.K. plant that currently builds the F-Pace.

Jaguar's in-house JEA platform, dubbed "Panthera", is being co-developed with Magna. New Jaguars are expected to feature 800-volt charging, sophisticated cloud architecture and everything else a super high-end EV customer would wish list.

The expectation is that the vehicles will be sportier in design and offer a more aggressive road-going attitude in order to distinguish themselves from Land Rover. It makes little sense for the company to have similarly featured SUV's across the range with only badging to differentiate brands.

Jaguar intend to stick with its plan of going all in on the ultra-luxury market. The new EV's are likely to start in the \$100,000 U.S. dollar range. High-end fully optioned versions will end up around \$150,000. Expect the larger GT to start upwards of \$150,000 U.S. with top of the line versions approaching \$250,000 ! The company has made it clear that the new Jaguar has the likes of Bentley, Lucid Air and high end Mercedes Benz models in it's sights. The new pricing strategy would make the I-Pace the entry-level Jaguar.

Jaguars recent struggles have been well documented. Perhaps the new strategy, reducing the model lineup and coming in at a higher price point will return the brand to profitability? Certainly this is the JLR vision for the marque. With the Land Rover brands selling fairly well the Tata Group is betting on the Jaguar EV to claw back market share. Is this the last kick at the Cat?

Clark Gable and the Jaguar XK120



Celebrity's are well known for their love of the finest things their fame and fortunes would allow. Not the least of which was to own and be seen driving some of the world's most exclusive automobiles.

A Hollywood hero for the ages, Clark Gable would make the top ten box office list a remarkable 16 times, claim an Oscar for his role in "It Happened One Night", deliver the line "Frankly, my dear, I don't give a damn," in Gone With The Wind, perhaps the most quoted line in the history of cinema and play a race car driver in "To Please A Lady".

Clark Gable was known for his love of fast cars and he owned a number of remarkable vehicles over his lifetime. Ladies man, man's man and box office champion he could afford the best and the best is what he bought. The man clearly loved to drive around in style. It must be said that Gable had exquisite taste.

In his collection were the 1935 Duesenberg Model JN, the 1936 Duesenberg SSJ Speedster, 1937 Ford Lincoln-Zephyr V12, 1938 Packard Eight Convertible Victoria, 1948 Jaguar 3.5 Litre Mark IV Drophead Coupe, 1955 Mercedes-Benz Gullwing and a 1956 Mercedes-Benz 300SC.

The Jaguar XK120 is a celebrity in it's own right, it was the fastest production car in the world at the time of it's release. It was powered by the same Jaguar XK engine that would win the 24 Hours of Le Mans five times in the 1950's. Unveiled at the 1948 London Motor Show as a showcase for the new Jaguar XK engine, a straight-six 3.4 litre power plant that could propel the car to a top speed of 120 mph the new car caused a sensation. Gable was smitten with the new Jaguar and was quoted declaring he loved the thing like a kid loves candy!

Priced at \$3,940 US the car was more much affordable than many of the cars he already possessed but he adored the XK's combination of beauty and performance.

Gable contacted Jaguar to personally insist that he be sold the very first XK120 to arrive on the US West Coast.

While most of the early cars were destined for racing Gable's XK120 was one of the first production cars to leave the Holbrook Lane production line in June, 1949.

His car was complete with competition inspired upgrades, wire wheels and bonnet louvres. He also requested a luggage rack on the boot for his golf clubs.

He took delivery of the car in Europe and used it on a cross-continental holiday with his fiancé' Suzanne Dadolle. They had met when he was there working on a film. It's reported the two became inseparable and were often seen out together dining in alfresco cafes and touring the European countryside. Their journey took them from Paris to Rome and across Europe causing quite the sensation when they would pop up among the locals.



Gable had the car shipped back to the United States in 1953 and registered the car in California. He would later sell the car to Irving Robbins Jr. The car would receive a full restoration in 2016 confirming the car retained it's original engine, chasis and body, making it a desirable full matching numbers example.

After restoration the car was shown to the world at the Concorso d"Eleganza Villa d'Este. The cars value is estimated to be \$500,000 - \$600,000 USD.





Mr. Gable loved the model so much that he would go on to own three other XK120's Two he would purchase and one, featured below, was gifted to him by the Indianapolis Motor Speedway owner Tony Hulman Jr. while the actor was in town filming "To Please A Woman". He would keep it stored there, where it still resides, and amazingly would use the car only once a year in May when Gable, a race fan would come back to town to see the race.

In a 1950 issue of Road & Track, Gable would pen an article titled 'My Favourite Sports Car" in which he would espouse on his attempt to reach the XK120's official 132 mph top speed. He didn't quite get there but did manage to coax 124 mph out of his completely stock and unmodified car.

Clark Gable's unpaid celebrity endorsement for the car surely bolstered the cars appeal as did the XK's impressive results on the racing circuits. 12,078 XK120's were sold through the cars production run to discriminating buyers and enthusiasts everywhere, and while today celebrities and fancy cars are nothing new some celebrities, like Gable and now Jay Leno, were much more in love with the intrinsic qualities of the cars they bought.
