There are five unique galleries inside the Sloan Museum.

Hagerman Street, Early childhood learning gallery. Interactive child-sized neighborhood with roundabouts for tricycles, shops, and a charming three-story tree house.

Durant Gallery, Vehicle gallery

11,000 square foot vehicle exhibition hall with rare collections of vintage and concept cars.

History Gallery

Regional interactive history from the earliest inhabitants through history-in-the-making.

Discovery Hall, Science gallery

Hands-on learning that makes science fun, like the giant interactive Great Lakes water table, Earth Globe, and 10 other hands-on spaces.

Fun Gallery, Exhibition Hall

5,000 square foot exhibition space for special traveling exhibits - "Mazes & Brain Games" runs February 3 -May 19, 2024.

We will meet at the Sloan Museum, 1221 E. Kearsley St., Flint, MI 48503 at 10 am on Saturday March 2. After spending a couple of hours wandering around the Museum, we will head out for an interesting lunch in the area. I haven't found the perfect spot yet but will before we get there. Any ideas? Admission is \$11 to \$14. As usual, invite your friends and family to join you. They haven't been there either.

Tied to the Sloan Museum, there is also the Longway Planetarium and the Applewood Estate. Those will be for a later time.

GingerMan is a road course, about 2 miles long, and the weekend event features multiple classes of cars, each running in a qualifying

in a qualifying race, then a 20 minute Sprint race.

This year we plan to attend the main race day on Sunday the 5th. The various class races begin at 8 am and finish around 5 pm, with a break mid-day for what they call "Touring" laps. That's when we can, for a mere \$35, drive our

own cars on the track. The track time for touring is around 50 minutes, which makes this quite a bargain. We enjoyed it immensely last year.
