Lakeview Lavender Farm, Pauls Valley Sharon and Bruce Parker

On June 8, 2024, eighteen adventuresome Jag Club members had a wonderful day doing something rather unusual for our Club: no cars, no museums, but a visit to a lavender farm right here in Oklahoma.



The Lakeview Lavender Farm in Pauls Valley is truly an unknown Oklahoma "gem" and those who attended can attest to that! I thought the guys might not be too excited about the event, but I was pretty sure the ladies would love it, and much to my surprise, the guys ended up enjoying it too!



We started the morning by meeting at Braum's in Norman, got our lavender colored Goody Bags filled with goodies to tide us over our trip down south, plus driving instructions and took off. We lucked out – there was no construction delays at Riverwind, so it wasn't long before we

turned off the big road, and traveled the smaller roads. The day was absolutely beautiful – sunny skies, lovely pastoral scenery- a great morning for a drive in our

shiny Jags!



We were met at the Farm by Koby Peters, the Leasing Operator. This amazing young man started out just being neighborly helping his friends, the Munns, grow their lavender. It didn't hurt that growing lavender is his passion, so as well as working full time as a mechanical engineer, helping his Granny run her farm, he also works and helps grow the lavender for the Munns, as



they near retirement.

Koby was very knowledgeable about the seven different varieties of lavender he was growing - no matter the questions we asked, he knew the answer! I was amazed at the depth of his knowledge and his joy in sharing it with us. Throughout the tour of the lavender fields, he cut samples of each of the varieties and passed it around for us to smell. After the tour, we went into the small Gift Shop for homemade lavender lemonade and lavender shortbread cookies (made by Marilou Munn) – both were delicious! Then Koby brought out his still and showed us how to make lavender oil – it took a big bushel of crushed lavender to make less than 30 cc of pure lavender oil! But the smell was awesome!!



We left enough time to finish our shopping, buy small potted lavender plants, cut our own lavender in the fields, and thank Koby, wishing him much success and telling him we would spread the word about this wonderful farm that we had only recently learned about. (Several of us have since written reviews on Trip Advisor and he's already had 11 hits!!!)

A short drive down the road took us to The Grille Restaurant, also in Pauls Valley, where the manager had our tables ready for us. The atmosphere was fun, the staff great, and the food delicious with LARGE servings! The homemade pies and cobblers, especially the Pecan Cobbler, were excellent!! We will be going back to The Grille on our way to and from Dallas! After lunch, we went home before the heat wave hit with full stomachs and cars smelling of lavender!!

Our COJA event on September 12, 2024 will be a tour of The Immaculate Conception Catholic Church and Lee Drummond's Mercantile in Pawhuska OK. We are currently in the planning stage. Lynette and I have driven the route, noted rest stops, and thought about what survival food goes into the goodie bags. We will meet 8:30 AM at Braums, 1129 W. Memorial Rd. OKC to leave about 8:45 AM for the 2.5 hour drive to Pawhuska to arrive about 11:00 AM at the Mercantile because Pawhuska is a touristy place, to find a places to park and eat lunch. The one-hour tour of the church starts at 2:00 PM. That is the only time the church provides for a tour.

The Osage built The Immaculate Conception Catholic Church in 1910 that is known for its stained-glass windows featuring American Indians. You won't see that type of subject matter in stained-glass windows anywhere else. The Catholic Church does not allow stained-glass windows depicting living people but some Indian figures in the stained-glass windows were alive when the windows were to be constructed so the Osage first received the needed permission from the Vatican to build

the windows. The church was added to the National Registrar in 1979.

The Mercantile has great food but we can't get reservations for a group our size, you can't get reservations at all, so our intent is to beat the crowd by arriving 11:00 AM. Anyone who wishes to eat at The Mercantile is welcome to do so but there may be a 30–45-minute wait. Across the street from the Mercantile is P-Town Pizza also owned by Lee Drummond. We will make reservations there for those that want to eat there.

Following lunch there is shopping at trendy stores and there are other museums to visit before we attend the church tour at 2:00 PM.

Fall Fling to Graham Texas By Jill York Dunham






