

#### 2024—A Year of Change for JAGM

With the passing of time comes change – this applies to JAGM as well as any other enterprise. The JAGM Board of Directors is currently working on two changes that affect each club member. The first change is in our club's membership and web communication systems; the second will affect how we send the monthly Indicator newsletter to members.

#### Membership and Web Communication Systems

With a transition in the membership chair position already underway, this is an ideal time to refresh our membership processes. A group of board members investigated many available systems and has settled on a club membership system with many great

features. WildApricot is a tool that incorporates membership records, website management, events, and much more into one interlinked system.

We've completed a month-long free trial of WildApricot and are now transitioning to the commercial site, which will allow us to discontinue subscriptions to the The Indicator - Printed and Mailed, Online, or Both? separate systems we've used for the past few years -Wix for the website hosting and development and JotForm for payment and form management.

So, what changes can members expect to see regarding membership, membership renewal, and website functions going forward? The following list represents the bulk of the planned changes.

Our JAGM.org website will be refreshed and streamlined

- Members will log into the new website using an ID and password that they will manage
- Members (active only) will be able to view and do the following:
  - ♦ Online Membership Directory, searchable on all permitted profile data fields, can communicate with other members who permit their phone and email to be visible to other members
  - A database of Service Providers for our cars
  - ♦ A forum, on which you can ask questions of other members, subscribe to receive updates, etc.
  - ♦ Upload a picture of your cars on the Our Cars album on the website's Home page.
- Renewal emails and invoices during December, renewal deadline of Jan 15th, and automatic renewals via credit/debit card if you decide to activate that option, pay by debit/credit card or personal check
- Profile—Each member will have control over their profile record, so they can limit the private information that they allow other members to see in the Membership Directory. Members' profiles also list each event they have registered for and how much they have paid, all emails they have received, etc.
  - Events: Members can see the number of registrations and who registered as long as the registrant permits their name to be visible when registering.

The plan is that these membership and website changes will be in place by December 2024. You will be hearing more as things progress.

In addition, the board has been looking at the club's expenses compared to its revenues. Our most signifi-

cant expense is the \$45 we pass along to JCNA for each member annually. The next largest expense is the printing and mailing of the newsletter, which works out to an annual cost of \$27.50 per member. With our annual membership



fee of \$75, that only leaves a few dollars of our yearly membership fee to be used for any other club func-

tions or needs.

We were fortunate to get a discounted printing price from a local printer in 2019 and that price has not changed. Unfortunately, just this month the printer has informed us that the equipment they use for *The Indicator* will no longer be supported by the manufacturer and they do not intend to make the large investment to upgrade this equipment, as they are approaching retirement. So, JAGM is looking for a replacement printer after the October newsletter. It's likely that the printing cost will go up significantly.

JAGM very recently sent members a survey asking one question regarding email versus USPS delivery options of *The Indicator*. 47% of our members responded, and of those, 84% said they would be satis-

fied with an emailed newsletter, while the remaining 16% favored a printed and mailed newsletter, even recognizing that it could come with an increase in the annual fee.

Stay tuned; the question of newsletter delivery is still under review, and we are investigating the cost of printing in the future. A possible outcome is a two-tiered annual membership fee with a lower rate for those who choose to receive emailed vs. the mailed, printed *Indicator*.

As always, please feel free to contact any of the Board members with your thoughts and suggestions. JAGM is thriving, and we all want that to continue!

message of Franklin Roosevelt's "Arsenal of Democracy" speech, she shares the incredible history of the Willow Run B-24 Bomber Plant and the teamwork of the powerful Detroit automotive industry. We will all cheer for the dramatic and vital roles played by women as they showed the nation that they were willing and able to fill the work force gaps caused by men going into military service. "We Can Do It' became the

rallying cry for millions of women who had, until this time period, never envisioned working on an industrial assembly line building the weapons of war. As a Tribute Rosie, Claire honors the women who are called "Original Rosies" because they worked "the line" during WWII. Under the auspices of the Veteran's History Project, their memories are being preserved because they are, indeed, veterans of the Home Front and their personal stories add depth and detail to our national narrative. You will be amazed, energized and inspired by this chapter of American History.

Claire is a volunteer at the Michigan Flight Museum

and the museum does not charge for the presentation, but please consider a donation to the museum the night of the meeting (cash or check payable to Michigan Flight Museum).
