



SDJC Camp Pendleton Drive and Picnic September 14, 2024

I must admit, having planned SDJC events for a few years, I was running out of ideas. Just in the nick of time, one day while having lunch with Annie Howe, she proposed a tour of Camp Pendleton. Not stopping there, to my relief Annie volunteered to take the lead and "make it happen". Little did she know how many hours of phone calls and trips to the base would be necessary, but she never gave up and as a result we had a delightful day of learning as well as relaxing at Camp Pendleton Marine Base.

By 9:00 a.m. Saturday morning, some of our 40 attendees were already arriving at the Visitor Parking Lot adjacent to the base checkpoint for our 10:00 a.m. processing. As required, Annie found SDJC members that are either active or retired military to serve as escorts for entry through the checkpoint. Our special thanks to John Bala, Jim Harkins, Igor Jercinovich, Lloyd Prosser, George Sterns, Mark Weatherup and guest Roy Williams. Our escorts reminded us the Military Police are diligent in enforcing base speed limits – why did everyone look at me?

Our next stop was to regroup near the Sergeant Reckless Statue for a group picture. Annie, an avid horse enthusiast, expertly told the story about Sergeant Reckless who served in the Korean War and was listed in Life Magazine as one of America's 100 greatest heroes right along with George Washington, Abe Lincoln, and others. The Marines adopted Reckless and he lived the reminder of his life on the base, free roaming, eating human food and drinking beer. He is buried and memorized at Stepp Stables on the base.

Driving to our next stop, the Mechanized Museum, Jim Harkins lead a group riding his Harley Davidson motorcycle instead of his regular XJ, in full biker gear! The Mechanized Museum contains Marine Corps transport vehicles and interprets the Marine Corps vehicular usage history through the years. It was dedicated in 2002 and includes an outstanding array of U.S. Marine Corps transportation and combat vehicle with history from WW1 to present day, including a WW1 vintage Ambulance to Gulf War HUMVEE. The vast majority of the vehicles are in running condition and often are used in parades and promotions.

The remainder of the event was spent on beautiful Lake O'Neil. Some members enjoyed sitting in the large, reserved lakeside cabana, while others planted their chairs closer to the water to enjoy their picnics and maybe adult beverages. An absolutely perfect day, blue sky, mild temperatures, great food and beverages, beautiful Jaguars. But more importantly, this adventure was an opportunity to spend time with our SDJC friends. Annie and I already have requests to "repeat", but next time touring the historical Ranch House on the Base.....sometime in the future.



2007 XJ8 Cooling System Repair

The following is a quick summary of a cooling system repair I performed recently on our 2007 XJ8.

I try to be pro-active, and repair before it breaks, but in this case, there were mitigating circumstances, or at least I'd like to think so. But on reflection I think it was the reluctance to do this, so I never got around...What do Jaguars do if they're feeling neglected? They bite!



To add insult to injury, the car "bit me" while at the paint shop having some clear coat repairs from sitting in the sunshine. I got a voice mail message something like "the car is ready – it looks beautiful, but there's a puddle underneath". Instead of driving home in a fabulous new looking XJ8, I had to tow it home on a trailer. Oh, the embarrassment!!



What to do? Drop it off at a shop for repairs? I feared starting the engine with a good coolant leak just to get from drop off to the service bay might cause further problems. I decided to do this myself. It's not too hard, but there's a fair amount of labor involved.



The coolant leak was "significant" and not obvious to locate. The leak appeared at the rear of the engine but was eventually traced to the throttle body, which on our car is at the front of the engine. How can the throttle body leak coolant? In case you're not aware, the throttle



body is connected to the cooling system. Why? I think it's a few

factors: Preventing water vapor in the air / fuel mixture from freezing. For you aviation folks, think "carb heat". The other factor might be emissions related. Anyway, the throttle body is connected to the cooling system. By the way, it's not just a "Jaguar thing", making everything more complex than necessary. In



preparing this article I saw the same throttle body / coolant entanglement in most modern vehicles.

The coolant hose is inside the valley of the V8 engine, which is quite a hostile environment for the rubber hose. Internet lore is the hose should be replaced after about 10 years or 80,000 miles to prevent unexpected failure. This is one of those inevitable "when not if" failures. Data point:

Mine survived for 98,000 miles and 17 years. It's also a data point on my perception of preventative maintenance. Oops!

So how did it go? The short answer is surprisingly well. The main challenge is getting access to the hose. My XJ8 is normally aspirated, not supercharged, which makes it easier since there are fewer parts to remove. Because the hose is under the intake manifold, I had to remove the manifold. To do that I had to disconnect the fuel pipes, the vacuum lines and all the electrical wires. I didn't expect I would also have to remove the windscreen wipers and remove all the plastic at the bottom of the windscreen. Everything came apart easily, but would it go back together? More on that later.



Now I'm very slow at car repairs. I enjoy it, so I kid myself that I'm savoring the experience. Truth is, I go very slowly so as not to make a mess of things. I remember a phrase from somewhere that "50% of maintenance is due to 50% of maintenance". I estimate this took me about 12 hours over three weeks (the middle week waiting for parts and going on vacation). Maybe a fourth week for the back ache to recover! I'm sure the repair shops will be far quicker, but it's legitimately a lot of work.

Parts required:

2 Gallons co	oolant & 5 Gallons distilled water	\$50.98

Takeaway thoughts. If you have a Jaguar V8 with 4.0 or 4.2 engine, this is a thing. It's surprisingly straightforward to do at home with a good tool kit, but does requires patience. A Jaguar shop can do this much quicker and has probably "been there / done that" a hundred times.



So, did it all go back together? Yes – for the most part. One piece of plastic crumbled in my hand while putting it back together. It was the electrical connector to the throttle body. After the initial grumbling and cursing, this turned into



probably the most satisfying repair ever. Ten minutes to de-pin the connector and re-pin to a brand-new connector shell. No soldering, no cutting, simply click the original pins into the new shell. To make it even sweeter, every pin locked firmly into place with a solid click. \$20.00 or so and complete refresh of the connector.

That repair was 2,500 miles ago, and the car drives great, looks great, and doesn't leave puddles!

Call to Order / Attendance:



The Meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm via Zoom Video Conference by the Club President.

The officers present were Dan Jensen, President; Diah Avery, 1st Vice President, Activities; Nedra Rummell, 2nd Vice President, Membership; Dave Allen, Treasurer & Chief Judge; James Waite, Secretary; Tim Calver, Newsletter Editor; Matt Allen, Webmaster; Tim Bennett, Director; Al Steele, Director; Dave Putnam, Director & British Car Club Council Representative; Jim Hallameyer, Dealer Representative; and Marie Allen, Historian.

Board Reports:

- **Secretary's Report**: James reported that the Minutes of the October 9, 2024 meeting were approved electronically. The Minutes were forwarded to the newsletter editor.
- Treasurer's Report: Dave A. reported for October, the activities include income of \$2,216.50 comprising \$225.00 in club dues, \$41.50 for a Classified Ad, and \$1,950.00 for the Election Luncheon. Expenses for October were \$435.91 comprising bank fees (\$4.91), JCNA dues paid on behalf of new members (\$265.00), monthly storage facility fees (\$158.00), and the monthly domain name email accounts fee (\$8.00). Overall, we had a net income of \$1,780.59. This was primarily due to time phasing of the Election Luncheon income ahead of the expenses, which will be in next month's reporting period. On September 16, the majority of the JCNA Board voted to increase membership dues by \$10.00. Currently, SDJC membership dues are \$80.00. With the increase, we will be sending \$55.00 to JCNA for each membership. However, instead of increasing your SDJC dues to \$90.00, the SDJC Board of Directors agreed to absorb the increase. Consequently, your membership dues for 2025 dues will remain at \$80.00. The JCNA dues increase announcement is presented below.

Re: Notice of Ten USD JCNA member dues increase for 2025

On September 16, 2024, the JCNA Board of Directors voted to raise JCNA membership dues to \$55 US. At-Large member rates rise \$10 US. JCNA Treasurer Bill Sihler reported an estimated loss for 2024 of approximately \$30,000 and projected at least a similar, if not larger, loss for 2025. It is the Board's duty and responsibility to set JCNA dues and therefore the Board acted responsibly. This increase is necessary to prevent more loss that would reduce JCNA's reserves below a prudent reserve. It is not the Board's desire for this increase to place a burden upon our members or our affiliated clubs, and it is the Board's sincere hope that it will not.

Three factors contribute to this rise in the cost of JCNA membership. The most relevant of these is a loss of several hundred members since the pandemic. Most of this \$10 increase is attributed to this. JCNA is a nonprofit private social club and legally required to fund its activities through income derived mostly from member dues. If overall membership levels drop, the remaining members absorb the cost from lower membership revenue. With overall membership at about 4300 members, approximately \$7 of this increase distributes JCNA's costs among us, to cover the \$30,000 revenue drop.

The second factor is pandemic-related inflation that caused The Jaguar Journal production costs to rise modestly; and thirdly a difficult decision by Jaguar Land Rover North America ("JLRNA") to withdraw its advertising presence from The Jaguar Journal in 2023. This \$27,000 advertising revenue had provided a several dollar member dues subsidy.

JCNA does not control member recruitment and retention, and JCNA does not dictate to affiliated clubs that it must do so. Each JCNA affiliated club has independence in this and collects dues and forwards a portion to JCNA. The late Mike Cook wrote an editorial in The Jaguar Journal that may be helpful and

insightful. In 1992, shortly after Jaguar Cars reached an agreement to transfer management and administration to JCNA, Mike wrote:

"We all need to understand that JCNA stands for strong relationships between independent groups of Jaguar enthusiasts. The national organization provides a common meeting ground and services for these affiliates. Let's not expect JCNA to do the job each affiliate is supposed to do." Mike's comments are still apropos today.

JCNA still provides a common meeting ground and services. JCNA provides insurance, competition programs like concours, slalom and rally. We provide that "common meeting ground" to support clubs through The Jaguar Journal, which celebrates 70 years in January 2025: we provide a website, social media, our executives, regional directors, committees and other volunteers and administrators. JCNA provides local clubs respected independence; and representation and a voice in JCNA. JCNA provides North American awards, trophies, regalia, publications, tool loans, and a tech line. JCNA maintains agreements with our Marque and privilege to use Jaguar logos. Our advertisers offer members discounts and sponsor local clubs.

Times have changed since a groundswell of energetic members volunteered when JCNA became independent. We are older; and \$4.50 in 1992 is worth \$10 today. Now JCNA pays for some services once performed by volunteers. Still, JCNA is mostly volunteer driven as are affiliated clubs, and none should forget that volunteer work subsidizes member costs, too. The JCNA Board and JCNA's committees are composed of member volunteers. The Board appreciates your understanding that this modest increase was needed. Thank you for allowing me to address this with you on behalf of the JCNA Board. Feel free to contact me with questions.
