Bring a Trailer Auctions - A Review By Roy L Stevens

After nearly 20 years of ownership, I decided it was time to depart with my 2002 XK8 convertible and find it a new home. After investigating numerous avenues to sell my beloved Jaguar, I decided on listing it on the *Bring a Trailer* (BaT) online auction site www.bringatrailer.com.

BaT is an online auction site for classic, collector, exotic, and enthusiast vehicles. They also hold auctions for boats, all terrain vehicles, automotive memorabilia, and other automotive related equipment. They claim to sell over 600 cars every week. The web site is very well designed and fairly intuitive to navigate. There is an extensive archive of past auctions arranged by vehicle make and model where one can examine how similar cars have fared in previous auctions.

For sellers, the process begins with a simple registration and uploading of photos of the car they are wanting to sell. Once accepted by BaT, more detailed photos and videos can be uploaded. Driving, walkaround, and cold-start videos are encouraged for all cars and videos of convertible top operation are encouraged for those type cars. There is an excellent tutorial on photographing the car which is very useful. For an additional fee, BaT will arrange a local photographer to meet you for a professional photo shoot. The base fee for listing your car on BaT without professional photographs is \$99.00 (buyers pay a 5% premium). I found the photo tutorial simple to follow and submitted my own photos and videos.

Once those are received, BaT assigns you an auction specialist to write your auction listing and arrange your photos and videos. I found the auction specialist very helpful in pointing out missing photographic views and videos necessary that would give my auction the best chance of success.

At some point, you will be asked if you wish to have a reserve for your auction and the amount. The reserve is that amount under which you won't accept at the end of the auction. That reserve amount must be accepted by BaT but can be lifted by yourself at any time before or during the auction. An unrealistic reserve will likely not be accepted. BaT is in the business to sell cars and doing work on an unrealistic reserve and not selling it is not a good business model. The archives mentioned above lists which cars had a reserve and whether or not that reserve was met. Many of the XK8s historically did not have a reserve and so my auction went with no reserve.

Most all auctions last one week. Potential bidders have the opportunity to ask questions during that time and have sellers answer them and supply additional photos or videos if requested. Although bids can be made at any time, the final day of the auction and especially the final hour is usually the most active. Sellers need to be present online during the final few hours to enjoy the bidding and answer any final questions. Any bids made within the final two minutes will extend the auction by that same amount of time for fairness and to allow all bidders a chance to make a final bid.

At the end of the auction, the high bidder is identified and the seller can communicate directly with the buyer to arrange payment, registration transfer and transportation of the car if desired. BaT offers services to buyers seamlessly taking care of those issues or the buyer has the option of doing it privately. In my case, the buyer of my car flew to Oklahoma City and the transaction was handled privately. I loaded the car on a transport the following day and bid farewell to my beloved XK8. It went to a good home who will cherish it as much as I did.

Overall, I would not hesitate to use BaT again to buy or sell a car that met their criteria. The process was relatively easy and I was happy with the amount I received. I did keep the license plate (JAGUAHR) just in case I ran across another Jaguar I just had

to have.
