


Hey, That Looks Familiar...

The criteria are listed at the right. The Membership Chairperson keeps track of everyone's points for the year, and determines who will be awarded first, sec-

Most Active Member Criteria

- 3 points—Showing a Jaguar at the JAGM Concours (per car)
- 3 points—Judging at the JAGM Concours
- 2 points Working at JAGM Concours
- 2 points—Judging at another JCNA club Concours
- 2 points—Showing a car or working at another JCNA club Concours
- 2 points—Showing a Jaguar at an "Event of Interest" as listed in the Indicator (You are responsible for reporting)
- 3 points—Coordinating a JAGM activity including preparing "Pre" and "Post" activity articles for the Indicator)
- 2 points—Attending a monthly meeting
- 2 points—Submitting an article to the Indicator
- 2 points—Recruiting a new member to join JAGM (You are responsible for reporting)
- 1 point—Driving a Jaguar to any club activity

Bob Stevenson: A Life Full of Jaguars

Those of us who are in love with all things Jaguar – especially the most iconic of the post-war cars (the Series 1 E-Type) — have lost one of our most knowledgeable experts of the car. On October 30, 2024, Robert (Bob) Louis Stevenson quietly passed away at the age of 89. He still had a twinkle in his eye whenever the topic of Jaguars was discussed and was surrounded by his family at the time of his passing. Bob's wife, Darlene, predeceased him in 2020, but he had his children, Rob, Lori and Linda, as well as five grandchildren, for support during his later years.

Bob moved up the ranks of JCNA when he became Regional Director for the North Central Region (12 US states and 2 Canadian provinces) and became deeply



involved in the Concours Rules Committee when it was formed about 25 years ago. He authored the JCNA Series 1 E-Type Judge's Guide, which was approved at the Annual General Meeting of JCNA in 2004. His publication is now the "bible" for anybody trying to win a national championship with a Series 1 E-Type.

Although Bob devoted a lot of time to JCNA, he never shirked his responsibilities to JAGM. Darlene and Bob probably have attended more JAGM

events than any other members in its history. Website Transition Information

Website outage

As we transition from our current Wix website to our new WildApricot website, the domain name transfer, the repointing of our DNS to the new website, and its propagation through the network will likely take several days. Thus, our website (www.jagm.org), and our (jagm.org) emails will likely be out of service for several days. The timing is uncertain, but the process should start on or after December 2, 2024.

You will know the new website is accessible when you receive an email asking you to log in. Initially, those emails will come from pwiltshire@comcast.net.

After this first email, you will receive an invoice for renewing your membership for the calendar year 2025. You must log in for the first time before renewing your membership.

Logging in

You must log into your Wild Apricot account to access member-only pages, change or update your Profile data, or pay an invoice.

Key points about logging in:

Access URL: Go to the website URL: https://www.jagm.org.

Login credentials: You can use the **email address associated with your membership** as your username and **the password sent to you via email.**

Forgot password: If you can't remember your password, click the "Forgot Password" link on the login page to receive a password reset link via email.


