
A Note to All Members





2007 XJ8 Transmission Fluid, Filter & Seals Replacement

Here's a quick summary of a transmission service I performed recently on our 2007 XJ8.



There's a mixture of advice regarding transmission service, and whether the fluid should be flushed. Most people say a power flush is a bad thing because it can be too harsh and blow out fluid from places where it's best not forcibly disturbed. A fluid drain and top up is gentle on the transmission but doesn't change all the

fluid. Per Jaguar, the transmission is sealed for life. However, according to ZF – the manufacturer of the transmission unit – a filter and fluid change every 50-60K miles is considered best practice. I went for the best practice route. My car has about 100K miles, and the filter was replaced by the prior owner at about 50K miles. I elected to replace the filter, top-up with new fluid and replace the few seals that are likely to give up after a while.

About the transmission: ZF is a world-famous transmission supplier based in Germany, and by 2006 had produced ten million transmissions. Incidentally – ZF is a major supplier of OEM Jaguar parts. They own WABCO (Westinghouse Airbrake Company) – the manufacturer of many of the air suspension components, and Lemförder – the manufacturer of the aluminum suspension systems.

The XJ8 uses a 6HP26 transmission: 6 – number of gears; H – Hydraulic shifts; P – Planetary gears; 26 is a measure of torque capability. Apparently 26 "ZFs" means 600 Nm or 442 ft-lbs, which is overkill for a naturally aspirated XJ8. The transmission is also used in other marques, such as Aston Martin Rapide / DB9 / DBS V12 / Virage / Vanquish, Bentley Arnage, BMW 7 Series, Jaguar S-Type / XF, Maserati Quattroporte, and Rolls-Royce Phantom.

So how did it go? The short answer is surprisingly well, but there were a couple of twists along the way. All this work is done under the car, so it's necessary to lift the car for access. The transmission filter is built into the transmission pan. To remove the pan, it's first necessary to drain the fluid. However – top -tip – before draining **anything**, it's always a good idea to make sure the fill plug is accessible and can be opened.


The fill plug is much lower than I expected. I double checked the ZF transmission manual several times before being confident that I had the right location. Access to the fill plug is OK, but the plug was very tight. I needed an extension on the wrench to loosen it (Don't remove yet...).

The drain plug is in the plastic transmission pan and was reasonably easy to undo. I left the car overnight to finish draining and caught about 7 liters of fluid. The kit had 6 liters of fluid, so I ordered an extra bottle. The genuine ZF LifeGuard6 fluid is expensive - about \$26.00 / liter.

Removing the pan was straight forwards. There are warnings of the Torx bolts stripping, the T27 heads breaking and needing replacing with sturdier T40 bolts. Mine were all T40 bolts (replaced at the prior service?) and came undone with a nice click. No issues.



I wanted to replace four tube seals, a mechatronic bridge seal and a sleeve seal that protects the electrical connectors. The transmission has a valve block inside with solenoids,



first the sleeve seal needs to be removed. It's not 100% clear that the sleeve needs to come out first, but it really does! The seal was very difficult to remove. I checked a couple of YouTube videos

and at least one resorted to a chisel to persuade the pesky sleeve seal to come out. Eventually the sleeve seal yielded its vice-like grip and came away looking rather



bruised and battered. Although ridiculously difficult, this was to become the second most difficult part of the process.



Removing the bolts for the mechatronic unit was straightforward and the unit came out easily. It's not very

heavy and one person can maneuver the unit out. It is, however, messy – in a fluid-up-your-arms kind of way.


To replace the four tube seals is very easy – just pull the tubes out and replace them with the ones from the kit. Two minutes max. The bridge seal is very easy – it's a square seal and literally takes two seconds to lift out the old and refit the new. I refitted the mechatronic unit and torqued up the bolts to 8 Nm (not a lot of ft-lbs).



Now to replace that pesky sleeve seal. Oh my! It needs to be inserted through a keyway, rotated a quarter turn, then the retaining collar should slip over the sleeve. The manual says it may need to be pressed in while simultaneously fitting the collar. After a long time with a prybar, and wooden blocks to not damage the sleeve – all was well. The collar engaged with a satisfying click. Some jobs are "character building" in a good way. That sleeve is just plain nasty! Hardest part of the procedure by far.

I'm sure there's a technique, but I don't have it. Maybe next time?

After fitting the new filter / transmission pan, there was only one job left to do – fill the transmission with new fluid. This was fun – in a good way really. But let's first describe why it's fairly involved: The fill hole is lower than the fluid level at rest. (That's right – the fluid would pour out if you opened the fill plug when the car is "off"). When the engine is running, the transmission fluid pump runs and distributes fluid all around the transmission. Automatic transmission fluid expands when hot / contracts when cold. Thats why the older



transmissions with dipsticks had a HOT and COLD mark. (Ahh – the good times when transmissions had a dipstick, and you could fill them from the top...)

Anyway, back to the fun fill procedure. I pumped in transmission fluid with the car off until fluid started to dribble out of the fill hole. Marie climbed into the car with a ladder (It's still in the air) and started the car. Matt was on infrared thermometer duty while I pumped more fluid in the transmission. Marie cycled between the gears to warm up the transmission. The idea is to fill the transmission with fluid so it's level with the fill hole at 40°C. After a few



minutes we were done and happy with ourselves. Marie was stranded in the car until we set up the ladder again for her escape. The transmission required almost 7 liters of fluid. We, on the other hand, required only a glass of wine to celebrate!.

This fill procedure isn't difficult. The fill hole is far enough away from the exhausts so there's no real danger of burns. It's time consuming to do this as a do-it-yourself project, and I'm sure our local specialists can do the job in a couple of hours.

And how is the transmission now? Perfect shifts – just like before!



Notes from the Concours Judges Tent

2025 Season By Dave Allen, Chief Judge, San Diego Jaguar Club



Get ready for the 2025 Concours Season! We have six JCNA Concours d'Elegance events planned for the JCNA Southwest Region.

- February 23, Jaguar Club of Central Arizona Valentine Vibrations Concours Scottsdale
- April 5, Jaguar Club of Southern Arizona La Encantada Plaza Tucson
- June 7, LA Club Concours Huntington Beach Central Park
- June 8, SW Regional Concours Huntington Beach Central Park
- July 12, SDJC 60th Concours d'Elegance Spanish Landing Park, San Diego

The first event in February will be in Scottsdale and the Jaguar Club of Central Arizona is looking for judges. (I stepped in at the last minute to be the Chief Judge for this Concours.) If you want some early Concours fun, the re-certification will have to be complete by mid-January to meet the 30 days prior regulations. There will be an on-line re-certification opportunity - date TBD. Please let me know if you want to help! Thank you!

There has been quite a bit of activity behind the scenes to get ready for the new season: Since late November a small team of reviewers have been busy proofreading the new 2025 JCNA Concours Rule Book. Additionally, I have updated the Judges Training Course for 2025, and it's now live on the JCNA website. The 2025 Judges Test is available on-line and is also posted on the JCNA Website. The 2025 updates are largely clarifications of existing rules with a couple of new rules.

There are also important changes to re-certification that all Judges need to be made aware of. In prior years, re-certification required an annual rule book training and a test at least every three years. Hands-on Judge training was optional but encouraged. From 2025 onwards, re-certification still requires annual rule-book training, but the test must be conducted every year. Hands-on Judge training is now required at least every three years and encouraged annually.

Most likely the online rule book training will be trimmed down to just the rule book changes and the on-line test. The deep dive into judging techniques will be optional and for only those who can't make a "live" Judge's School such as our hands-on session.

We haven't arranged "Hands On" Judges Training yet, but it should be a fun event to practice judging with official score sheets, JCNA Concours Rule Books and JCNA Judge's Guides. The objectives of the event are to practice without time limit on a couple of cars, and then "graduate" to a judging event in the regulation 15 minutes. By the way - this is also a great opportunity to bring your own Jaguar for some non-competitive insight, or think of it as Concours pre-inspection! Keep an eye on the events page on the website for details.

We are continually looking for a few good women and men to become new Concours Judges. The process of becoming a judge is simple and there's never been a better time with all the training coming up! Note that judges can focus on models they have the most familiarity, or study with experts on models they want to appreciate more thoroughly.

Call to Order / Attendance:

SDJC Board of Directors Meeting Minutes

The Meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm via Zoom Video Conference by the Club President.

The officers present were Dan Jensen, President; Diah Avery, 1st Vice President, Activities; Dave Allen, Treasurer, and Chief Judge; James Waite, Secretary; Matt Allen, Webmaster; Tim Bennett, Director; Al Steele, Director; Dave Putnam, Director, and British Car Club Council Representative; and Terry Tilton, Director and Auto Museum Representative.

Board Reports:

- Secretary's Report: James reported that the Minutes of the November 13, 2024, meeting were approved electronically. The Minutes were forwarded to the newsletter editor.
- Treasurer's Report: Dave A. reported that for November, the activities included income of \$4,029.00, comprising \$1,000.00 for the election luncheon and \$3,029.00 for the holiday party. Expenses for November were \$3,734.09, comprising bank fees (\$81.82), election luncheon payment to The Butcher's Shop (\$3,593.99), monthly storage facility fees (\$158.00), and website and digital communication (\$160.16). The fee includes Zoom for a year. Overall, we had a net expense of \$294.91 for the month. The election luncheon operated at a loss of approximately \$890. This was expected due to the approved \$15/person subsidy, and the numbers came out perfectly. The final invoice for the Holiday Party is not available.

For December, the activities included income of \$1,647.00, comprising \$957.00 for the holiday party, and \$690.00 for the Monserate Winery & Drive. The SI-100 (Statement of Information Form) was filed with the Secretary of State. Expenses for December were \$3,553.16, comprising bank fees (\$155.20), final balance for the holiday party (\$2,829.65), filing fee for the SI-100 form (\$20.00), monthly storage locker fee (\$158.00), trophies and awards for Member of the Year 2024 and 2023 and the 2024 Member Service Award (\$226.81), and the monthly payment for the domain name email accounts (\$5.50). We had a net expense of \$1,748.16 for the month, largely due to the time phasing of holiday party receipts and expenses. Club finances remain healthy.

For January, the activities include income of \$4,405.00 for 2025 membership dues, of which a significant portion will be paid to JCNA, and \$1,080.00 from our sponsors for advertising. Expenses for January are \$1,530.00 for two years of website hosting through 2026.

The 2024 Annual Summary is provided per Section 5.06.4 and Section 8.03 of the bylaws. The Financial Report is on the website and accessible from the member page.

Activities Report: 1st **Vice President, Activities:** Diah reported that:

• She has been working on the 2025 Calendar of Events (see below). We still need a special committee to support and work together to make our events more successful for our club. On Saturday, she will be recruiting more people for this committee. She plans to work with Nedra and the activities committee to schedule dates for the 2025 events. She plans to add a drive and luncheon to Julian to the calendar. She is looking forward to adding more activities in 2025. If anyone has suggestions, please forward them to Diah.






