The Passing of Another COJA Member By Sarah Baxter

Following an infection of the heart which triggered several strokes, Clifton Hill passed away at OU Health Center on June 10, 2025, at the age of 82.



Clifton was a very friendly and kind man but did not talk about himself much. After graduating from Shawnee High School in 1962, he attended Oklahoma Baptist

University, graduating in 1965. After graduating OBU, he opened and operated Import Autos, joined the Oklahoma Army National Guard, and taught History at Shawnee High School before joining the Shawnee Fire Department for the next 25 years, retiring as Battalion Chief. Clifton was an avid antique car enthusiast. His first car was a 1928 Chevrolet, purchased for him by his uncle, and was a treasure that he kept the rest of his life. On May 1, 1975, he opened the Museum of Special Interest Autos. Clifton loved to attend car shows and swap meets, as well as being a member of the Model A Club, Model T. Club, Chevrolet Jaguar Club, Studebaker Club. Club. Horseless Carriage Club, as well as many others. Clifton is survived by his wife, Betty, of the home; a daughter, Katherine Hill; one grandson, 4 granddaughters, 10 greatgrandchildren, a brother, and a number of cousins and friends. Clifton's funeral was on June 17th, at the Wesley United Methodist Church in Shawnee.

As we have done in the past, a monetary donation has been made to a charity of the family's choice, OU Health Center Comfort Care, in memory of Clifton.

JOANT Concour In Dallas, TX. By Jeff Hand

On June 7, 2025 Lynette and I attended the JOANT Concour where I served as a judge. About 35 Jaguar cars were entered into the concour held at the Commemorative Airforce Museum in Dallas, Texas. JCNA uses a specific method of judging I haven't seen at other car shows. The vehicle to be judged must pass an operational inspection e.g. do the headlights work and stuff like that, the exterior is judged and the interior is judged. Often grading is based upon cleanliness because the cars have all the correct parts. The effort used to clean your

car is the only known acceptable form of OCD behavior I know of. There are two classes of competition. Driven class involves judging the interior and the exterior of the car. Champion class adds judging the trunk and the engine bay. To be a judge you must pass an exam and participate in annual training. The training has become much better because you are shown examples of how to judge; however, the judge must still use his own discretion in how to score. Yes, that sounds involved but anything worth doing is worth doing well. Judging ethics do not allow the destructive scrutiny of a vehicle. Instead the judges through scoring and conversation point out what the entrant can do to improve their Jaguar if improvement is needed, complement the entrant on the work that has been done and provide advice if requested. JCNA not Pebble Beach and JCNA not a Show and Shine where everyone votes for best of show. JCNA is about Jaguar cars and COJA's absence from the schedule of annual concours according to J.J. Keig, JCNA President, has been a detriment to the promotion of the marque because OKC is a midway point for concour participants from Dallas, Tulsa and Kansas City. Travel time to a concour is a consideration and shorter travel times are preferred. J.J. Keig proposes a concour in a box for OKC for concour entrants who would like a closer judging venue to score their car for national recognition. J.J. Keig says all they need is a location and JCNA will provide the judges and materials for the concour. COJA would be the sponsoring club and COJA members can participate as they wish. This would be a small competition. Perhaps it could serve as a guys outing. I personally like the idea of a concour in a box and I hope COJA feels the same. I look forward to hearing from you about it as I explore this idea.

A draft of the proposed JCNA Series 1 E-Type Judge's Guide, which contains over 300 pictures detailing the many variations and production changes that the E-Type went through, is now available for review on the JCNA web site.

In an effort to make verifying items during a concours, this Guide follows the JCNA Score Sheet.

Headings are presented just as they are on the score sheet. Subheadings are also presented detailing

items not specifically address on the score sheet but that must be judged during a concours. Due to file size, the Guide is presented in two parts, Exterior-Interior and Boot-Engine.

Please download these two files and review them on your computer.

Comments must be received by September 30th so that they can be reviewed and implemented. This JCNA Series 1 E-Type Judge's Guide will be up for review and approval at the 2026 AGM.
