Ellie and I have just returned from a great weekend up in the Petoskey area for the Bay Harbor Car and Boat Festival. We aren't going to have that article ready for this month's Indicator, but every year we've had a great time there; the activities and the festival are unique and it's always wonderful to spend time with nice people who have common interests.

This month I just want to share a couple ideas that have popped up and are bouncing around in my head. In no particular order:

Jaguar Forums—a Useful Tool

I've spent a lot of time surfing on JaguarForums.com to help diagnose, understand and fix things on my cars. Typically, if I have a problem with one of the cars I can find others who have already found and dealt with the same problem. Not always in the best way, mind you, but I find I can generally get a good headstart from reading about others' experiences.

That's probably not news to most of you, but here's a recent example that illustrates my point. I got a text one evening from Dianne and Richard Gouin. The emergency flasher lights on their XK8 wouldn't turn off, and they wondered if I had ever seen that problem on mine. I hadn't, but my first thought was to search the Forum for a similar problem, and I quickly found a series of entries from a half dozen people with the same issue. They all pointed to the switch on the console as the cause of the problem and several people shared methods they had used to "unstick" the switch. I sent the link to Dianne and she followed one of the suggestions, which was to use a credit card. Not to buy a new switch, but to pry up the edg-

es of the switch and allow it to release. I'd call that an optimal use for a credit card!

It was one example, and a relatively minor problem, but why not use forums like this to get pointed in the right direction, whether you're going to fix a problem yourself or take it to someone else?

Printed vs. Online Indicator—How's it Going? We're halfway through the first year of printing and mailing The Indicator only to members who pay the \$25 subscription fee. The overwhelming majority of members opted to save the money and receive The Indicator online.

I'm wondering how members feel about their decision, now that you've had a chance to live with it for a while. If you opted for online delivery, has that worked out well for you, or would you rather pay for the subscription next year? And if you opted for the subscription, will you continue to do so in the future?

If you have thoughts you'd like to share on this, please contact me or any other board members. This was a significant change to the club's communication scheme, and we want to make sure that we're providing the best communications and service that we can.

OK, that's enough of this. It's summertime, let's drive!!




