
UPCOMING EVENTS: PREVIEWS OF WHAT'S ON JOCO'S EVENTS CALENDAR

Jaguar's Great Reset

Jaguar's Great Reset: Grace, Space, and the Brutalist Gamble

The Jaguar enthusiast community is currently witnessing a transformation so seismic it makes the transition from the XK120 to the E-Type look like a minor trim update. For me, my garage floor may still hold a few drops of oil from a 1970 E-Type, while my daily driver is the whisper-quiet Audi e-tron GT. I understand the duality of Jaguar: the historical “Grace, Space, Pace” and the modern necessity of high-voltage performance. However, the “Great Reset” currently underway at JLR is testing the loyalty of even the most ardent fans as the brand pivots toward an ultra-luxury, electric-only future.



material honesty and stance. Instead of the cold, sterile visuals seen in early marketing, the production cars need to utilize the “elongated hood” proportions that suggest power, even in an EV. By incorporating tactile, high-end materials—like knurled metals and sustainably sourced woods—into that geometric exterior, Jaguar can transition from “austere” to “architectural.” The goal shouldn’t be to copy the E-Type, but to evoke its presence through a modern, “sculpted” lens that prioritizes sophistication over mere shock value.




The Brutalist Shift: Bridging the Gap from E-Type to Type 00

The most jarring aspect of Jaguar’s recent reveal is the move toward a Brutalist design language. For a brand built on the “slinky” curves and feline proportions of the 1960s, a monolithic, slab-sided aesthetic feels like a betrayal of DNA. To make this attractive to long-time Jaguar fans, the company must find a way to re-insert the “human imprint” and “visual drama” that defined classic silhouettes.

It is possible to marry Brutalism with Jaguar’s heritage by focusing on

The Three-Motor Dilemma: Why the Best Layout is Worth the Wait

Jaguar’s upcoming Type 00 is set to launch with a tri-motor setup producing roughly 1,000 hp. On paper, this is a masterpiece of engineering, offering advanced torque vectoring that mimics the agility of a much lighter car. However, for the discerning buyer who values long-term reliability and peak performance, there is a strong argument for waiting until later in the product cycle.



The automotive industry is on the cusp of a revolution with in-wheel (hub) motor technology. While tri-motor systems are powerful, they still rely on complex gearboxes and driveshafts to deliver power. True four-motor “per-wheel” systems—likely to mature in the 2027–2028 window—eliminate these mechanical failure points entirely. Waiting for this advancement would provide a vehicle with significantly better traction control, as a central “brain” could blip torque at each corner with microsecond precision. For a heavy EV, this isn’t just about speed; it’s about the safety and “composed” handling that Jaguar owners expect.

Reliability Through Simplification

The Achilles’ heel of Jaguar has historically been the complexity of its systems from Lucius (may he burn in hell) electrics to the mess that was in my 2004 XKR (getting it to pass smog was a nightmare) and my 2012 F-Type (with too many batteries). In the EV era, reliability is dictated by thermal management and software integration. Jaguar is currently testing prototypes in the Arctic Circle to ensure the battery and tri-motor system can withstand -40°C extremes. By moving toward a dedicated EV platform, Jaguar removes the “leak points” of the internal combustion era, but they replace them with high-voltage electronics that require robust sealing.

An attractive, reliable vehicle in this new age must be “software-defined” but “mechanically simple.” This is where the four-motor layout mentioned above becomes the ultimate reliability play. By removing the differential and CV joints, you remove the parts most

likely to wear out over a decade of use. A Jaguar that stays on the road—not just in the shop—is the only way to win back the “Grace, Space, Pace” reputation.

The Market Reception and the Path Forward

The initial rebranding rollout was met with significant backlash, largely because it ignored the emotional connection fans have with the “Leaper” and the brand’s racing heritage. To create an “attractive” vehicle for the Northwest enthusiast, Jaguar needs to pivot its messaging. The focus must shift from “abstract exuberant art” back to “engineering excellence.”

The Type 00 needs to prove it can handle the damp, winding roads of the Pacific Northwest with the same poise as a classic XJ. If the car can deliver 430 miles of range and 15-minute charging, it addresses the “reliability” of the experience—knowing the car will get you home regardless of the infrastructure.

Wrapping Up

Jaguar is at a crossroads where the only way forward is a radical departure from the past. While the Brutalist design may be a bitter pill for lovers of 1960s curves, the underlying technology—specifically the promise of 1,000 hp and advanced torque vectoring—offers a performance ceiling the brand has never touched

before. However, the wise enthusiast may want to keep their current GT for another year or two. As motor technology shifts from inboard tri-motor setups to even more reliable and capable in-wheel four-motor systems, the “best” Jaguar may be the one arriving just after the initial relaunch. For now, we watch the Arctic testing with cautious optimism, hoping that the “Grace” of the cat remains even as its “Pace” becomes electric.. £




